## Real Cross-Cultural Partnerships Aren't Just Dreams

When Teleios Ministry was started, one of the goals was to bring together Teleios partners from other parts of the world to assist each other. Our first venture was bringing Bernard Mwangi from Kenya to Romania and bringing Romanian (Hungarian ethnic) pastors to Kenya.

In 2009, Adrian Giorgiov, a Hungarian/Romanian pastor, established ProAfrica, a Romanian foundation that provides assistance to over 250 Kenyan orphans and vulnerable children and over 130 Tanzanian orphans and vulnerable children. He continues to lead that program visiting both Kenya and Tanzania to find ways to enhance this program in order to benefit as many children as possible.

In January 2012, a five-year plan was finally realized when Bernard traveled to Tanzania to meet and work with Mpeli Mwaisumbe. The two quickly developed the kind of relationship that is the foundation of Teleios Ministry. Soon, they were talking about working together in partnership. Continued on page 2

As you read in the January newsletter, the results from the first Holiday Bible Week were beyond all expectations as more than 260 children participated in the 2011 camp when the goal had been 150!

In April of this year, the Gatunguru group of churches is going to try conducting its first Holiday Bible Camp using the lessons learned and skills developed during last year's Bible Week. Teleios Ministry has been asked to return for the November Camp and bring a team to assist.

One of their first partnership endeavors was conducting two Pastor and Leadership Conferences in Tanzania - one for 25 pastors and leaders in Iringa and another for 38 pastors and leaders in Mbeya. Bernard, Mpeli and I provided training for Pentacostal, Lutheran, Baptist, and indigenous ministry pastors and leaders.

Then, in February, Bernard traveled to Romania to assist Attila Toth and the Leesburg (Virginia) Partnership in evangelistic outreach in the Apalina Gypsy (Roma) community and the Gornesti community. The result was 110 decisions to follow Jesus Christ

The building of cross-cultural partnerships does not have one particular U.S. partner. Each is supported by those who give un



designated gifts to Teleios Ministry or who donate with instructions to use "where it can be best used." When we first started Teleios Ministry, these funds enabled us to develop partnerships in Romania, Kenya, and Tanzania. In fact, originally most partnerships were developed using these undesignated funds.

These undesignated funds are essential to the mission of Teleios Ministry. The success of the growing network of partnerships goes back to the investment of our early partners who gave from \$25 to \$100 per month or as God moved them to give.

The fruit of those early investments is tremendous. Bonnie and I have continued to pray about how best to share the value of this type of partnerships. We are asking you to partner with us again in investing in the development of new global partners. The result over the past 11 years has been amazing.

Women's Conferences, Children's Camps Provide Opportunity For Christ-Centered Growth

### Tanzania Women's Conferences To Focus On Transformation, Not Just Information

Can you imagine no Bible study or discipleship training for 10 years?

That's what Bonnie Parker and Tina Thomas heard over and over again from participants in the first Tanzanian women's conferences they held last March. On my trip to Tanzania in January, I met with some of those women. The impact of these conferences has been significant in the development of ministry for them.

When you consider that there is no active Bible-centered, life-skill teaching that focuses not just on information but transformation – real



hands-on development of local ministry and women's groups committed to growing in Jesus Christ - the critical need for women's conferences is evident. As last year's participants told other women about the challenge that the Teleios team presented to them, more and more have asked for the opportunity of study and training.

Because of the daily tasks many of the participants have of gathering water, working in the fields, and other duties, we learned that the women must have a retreat setting. This allows them focused time in prayer, study, worship, and encouraging fellowship. Thus, this year's conferences have been designed as two- and three-day events.

You can be a part of transforming the lives of your Christian sisters in Tanzania through prayer and financial support. The cost per woman for a three-day conference is only \$70. This includes food, lodging, transportation, and materials.

Each conference averages 20 women, so the total sponsorship of one conference is \$1,400. Teleios Ministry has had a request for four Women's Conferences.

### Reflections From the Green Chair.....

I wrote in August 2007, "Missions is the active, visible expression of God's purpose in the world. God has been seeking to make us serious about being the mission since Adam and Eve sinned." My reflections over the past months have returned to this time and time again.

When God called Abraham to leave his homeland and go to the place that He would show him, He followed that call with these words in Genesis 12:1-3: "And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. And in you all the families of the earth will be blessed."

God called Abraham to be the mission and the blessing. We cannot escape the fact that Abraham's embracing of being the blessing is the heart of mission. Verse 2 makes this quite clear, "...you will be a blessing." Notice the focus. Look at how many times we see the pronoun "I" in reference to God. God will "make you a great nation," "bless you," "make your name great," "bless those who bless you," "curse those who curse you." None of these were Abraham's to accomplish. Abraham was to be the active, visible expression of God's purpose in the world.

God is the primary focus in this passage. Abraham was the blessing, not a conduit of the blessing but the actual blessing. You are the active, visible expression of God's divine purpose in the world. Isaiah 49:6 says "...he said, It is a light thing that thou should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved of Israel. I will also give you for a light to the Gentiles, that you will be my salvation unto the end of the earth."

THE MISSION – "I will give you as a light to the nations. You exist to be my salvation unto the end of the earth." Jesus singled out this concept and applied it to His disciples and followers when He said, "I am the light of the world." He also said, "You are the light of the world."

Jesus did not say that through you the light would be revealed. He said, "You are the light of the world." You cannot separate the mission from you – it's in your DNA. You are the visible, active expression of God's redemptive and divine purpose in the world. We cannot escape that reality and its implications for us.

Emil Brunner said, "A church exists by mission as a fire exists by burning." The

same can be said of each person. Take a mission from us, and we cease to be who God created us to be. Mission is who we are - it's in our DNA.

When Jesus came and inaugurated His Kingdom, His last words to His followers – which includes you and me – are all words of mission. These words send us out to care for the earth and all it has and is, including the humans who occupy it.

At the very heart of who we are as creations of the Creator, as new creations in Christ, we are on mission; because it is who we are. Where and when did missions become the organized, institutionalized realm of the ordained and under the control of a group? We sit and wait be sent. We sit and wait for a group, agency or board to tell us the how, when, where, and who of missions.

The time has come for every follower to embrace their heritage, to live out the freedom given by Jesus, to let out that person who God created him/her to be and to do. Mission is in our DNA. We do not do missions. We are missions. God made us that way, and in Jesus Christ He redeemed the mission in us.
