# Women's Conferences Set For Romania And Tanzania

This spring, Teleios will assist indigenous leaders in conducting conferences for women in Romania and Tanzania. While the focus of these conferences is different, they each will provide a time of Bible teaching and fellowship for the Gypsy women and the Tanzanian women. Partners are needed for both conferences.

Attila and Adel Toth were with us in October, which has been the time of the annual Roma conference. For this reason the conference was rescheduled to March 23 this year. Hopefully the harsh cold winter will have begun to abate, and the ladies will be able to travel unhindered to the conference.

The theme of this conference will be "Children of God." We will focus on God's love for his children and how we as moms can emulate our heavenly Father's love as we parent our chil-

dren. Many Gypsy women become moms at a very early age with little or no parenting knowledge.

In Gypsy culture, children have never been valued, so as the adults have come to salvation and are being taught from God's Word, they are recognizing the need for instruction in parental responsibility and authority. Many have made terrible decisions regarding their children and need assurance and reassurance of God's grace as they reconcile past actions. We pray they will learn ways to be Godly parents in the future.

In Tanzania, the conference will be conducted in Mbeya and Iringa, on March 29 –April 7. It is an invitation-only conference. Pastors' wives, deacon's wives, and women who are leaders in their churches from several denominations have been asked by

# Dreaming Of A Better Life For Their Village

The village of Inolo was officially formed in 2009. Before its formation, the people were under the authority of another village five miles away. The people came together and formed a village with a population of 559. They plant corn and beans as their main food crop and are planting coffee as a cash crop.

Why form a village? Because they had a dream of a school, medical care, orphan care, and clean drinking water – all located in their area, not miles away.

The area of Inolo faces many challenges. Thirty-five orphans live in Inolo. There are 13 people with HIV/AIDS. The closest school is over eight miles away; the closest medical clinic is 10 miles away. The village does not have a viable water source. Water is available during the rainy season and following, but not available during the dry season. The only good water source is far away, and the women spend most of their time traveling six-seven miles round-trip over hilly terrain to get water.

The people of Inolo realized that change would only come if they did something about it. They have a dream to overcome



these challenges. Already they have begun making bricks to build a school and medical dispensary. They are trying to raise funds and find partners to help with a year-round water source.

Bonnie and I visited the village with Mpeli and Neema Mwaisumbe in December 2010. The Inolo village leadership presented us with a copy of their dream. We, Teleios Ministry, have never had such a well done proposal.

In addition to all that the villagers have dreamed, a local businessman who hosted us at the village also has a dream. His dream is that a church will be started in the village.

We are seeking those who will partner with these who have shared their dreams and who will bring the good news of Jesus Christ. Please contact us if you are feeling led to be that partner. Call Teleios at 864-322-9775.

# Reflections From the Green Chair.....

There is not enough room to put all my reflections at this time. All of the reflections center around the call of God upon our lives. Unfortunately, calling has too often been divided between the "professional" and the "lay." Also, calling has been graded as to how seriously we should take one call verses another. It may sound too simple, but, when God calls, it is serious regardless of any preconceived level or status attached to it.

The one thing the Bible bears out is that God's call is never fuzzy. When God calls, a person knows it. The question isn't whether we know it's God's call. The question is our obedience or our reluctance to answer.

There are so many verses and stories related to this subject that deciding which ones to focus on is challenging. Every time God calls, He never supplies all the details. God's call is always open.

Hebrews 11:8 says, "Abraham obeyed God not knowing where he was going." Moses was to go to Pharaoh, but the details of deliverance and the process of deliverance were not disclosed. Paul was called to be the Apostle to the Gentiles, but the timeframe and details were never

revealed except as he moved along in obedience.

Isaiah was worshipping because he was hurting for Israel during the death of a good King. In worship, he overheard God speaking (Yes, that is correct, God did not call Isaiah's name), "Who will we send, who will go for us?" Who will go where? How general can any call of God be! Without the details and very little of the general information, Isaiah said, "Here I am! Send me!" My point is that sometimes God's call is not direct, but we overhear a need and that becomes our call. We say, "Here I am! Send me!" Then, we find out what's really involved.

The disciples were in their marketplace setting when Jesus came and said, "Come, follow me!" Not a lot of details were given. Truth is we want the details—cost, resources, time, etc. The call of God is always about serving others in His name. It is never focused on us. The call of God is about other people.

Lastly, the call of God always costs. Here is the hard part. The call of God always costs other people in my or your life when we respond. No matter how hard I try, we cannot remove from other people

the cost of my call upon them. Silas went with Paul and found himself in prison. Mary was deeply affected by the call of God on Jesus. The list includes family, innocent bystanders (Simon of Cyrene to carry the cross of Jesus), fellow servants, and churches.

Why am I saying all of this? Every newsletter, blog, or tweet that Teleios Ministry sends is based on God's call – God's call upon me, Bonnie, Meg or a partner. They have within them the opportunity of a call by God to you. Every one of them involves cost to us and cost to others. The truth is that the information is never enough.

In fact, if the call is packaged with every question answered, every detailed covered, or every event organized, then you have to wonder if it's God's call. I can't find where God's call is neatly packaged. Every vision begins with the call.

My deepest prayer is that this newsletter affirms a call, contains a call, or identifies a call of God upon you. I pray this newsletter is God's instrument of call.
