Romanian Partner Leaves Lasting Impression In First U.S. Visit





Reflections From the Green Chair.....

"You are the active, visible expression of God's purpose in this world." Jesus said, "As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Jesus directly tied our "life mission" or purpose to His purpose. As followers of His, they are inseparable. We have been sent by Jesus as Jesus was sent by the Father.

As I reflect on this, I am struck by the motivating reason that God sent Jesus. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only, unique Son..." Jesus was sent because of God's love. The reality is that I am sent by Jesus because of His love. Jesus' love motivates Him to send me. That is a humbling reality. In fact, it's really too big for me. Yes, I am the active, visible expression of God's purpose in this world, but now I have to add, "BECAUSE HE LOVES THIS WORLD."

You and I are expressions of God's love for the people in the workplace, the store, the restaurant, the ball field, the church. I am not just doing a project or teaching a class - I am an expression of God's love for the people I serve in His name. If that is not enough, then consider this - I am the expression of God's love for all the people I encounter.

One my trip to Tanzania and Kenya and mine and Bonnie's trip to Romania, a huge reality hit me because of this. We preach and talk forgiveness of sin. If I am the active, visible expression of God's purpose because of His love for this world, then my forgiving others when they wrong me or others is a direct reflection of God's forgiveness.

John 3:17 reminds me that Jesus was not sent into the world just to judge or condemn it but to save/restore it. The end result of everything I do is forgiveness that leads to salvation/restoration. We talk forgiveness, but I realize how empty our message is because we do not forgive with purpose based in love.

What really hit me in reflecting on this is that the reason many people struggle with forgiveness is because they do not see it expressed in the lives of those who profess it. God forgives, but you failed us. Could that be why Jesus tied our forgiveness to our forgiving others?

If I am the active, visible expression of God's purpose/mission because of His love for this world, then I must be redemptive in forgiveness. I must be gracious and merciful. Yes, I must treat sin

seriously, but I must treat forgiveness, salvation, restoration, grace, and mercy just as seriously. Does that change everything about how I go about the life He has given me? I am sent by love. I am the expression of His love to the people I meet and serve everyday. I don't know about you, but that has really had an impact upon me.

Jesus gave us an unbelievable mission statement—a life purpose... "AS THE FATHER SENT ME, SO I AM SENDING YOU. Then, He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He empowered us and filled us with the capacity to accomplish His sending purpose. He made us who we are through the gift of His Spirit.

You are the active, visible expression of God's purpose/mission in this world because of His love for this world. Your life is the message. You are the messenger. Forgiveness, Grace, Mercy, Restoration, and Salvation are yours to give to the people you meet every day. This is who we are. This is what we do.
